

What are the aims and intentions of this curriculum?

The aim of our Key Stage 5 Curriculum is to enable manipulation and experimentation of the student's skills taught for BTEC Level 3 Art & Design Certification. The aim is to expose them to the knowledge and application of artistic characteristics to develop their professional understanding and practices of the Art & Design Industry and meeting a client's requirement. The students will engage with the curriculum through a business approach, this is a key component of the curriculum. They will evaluate their research and record their views on influential artists and their techniques, manipulating the knowledge and skills to further develop their own creative work.
